

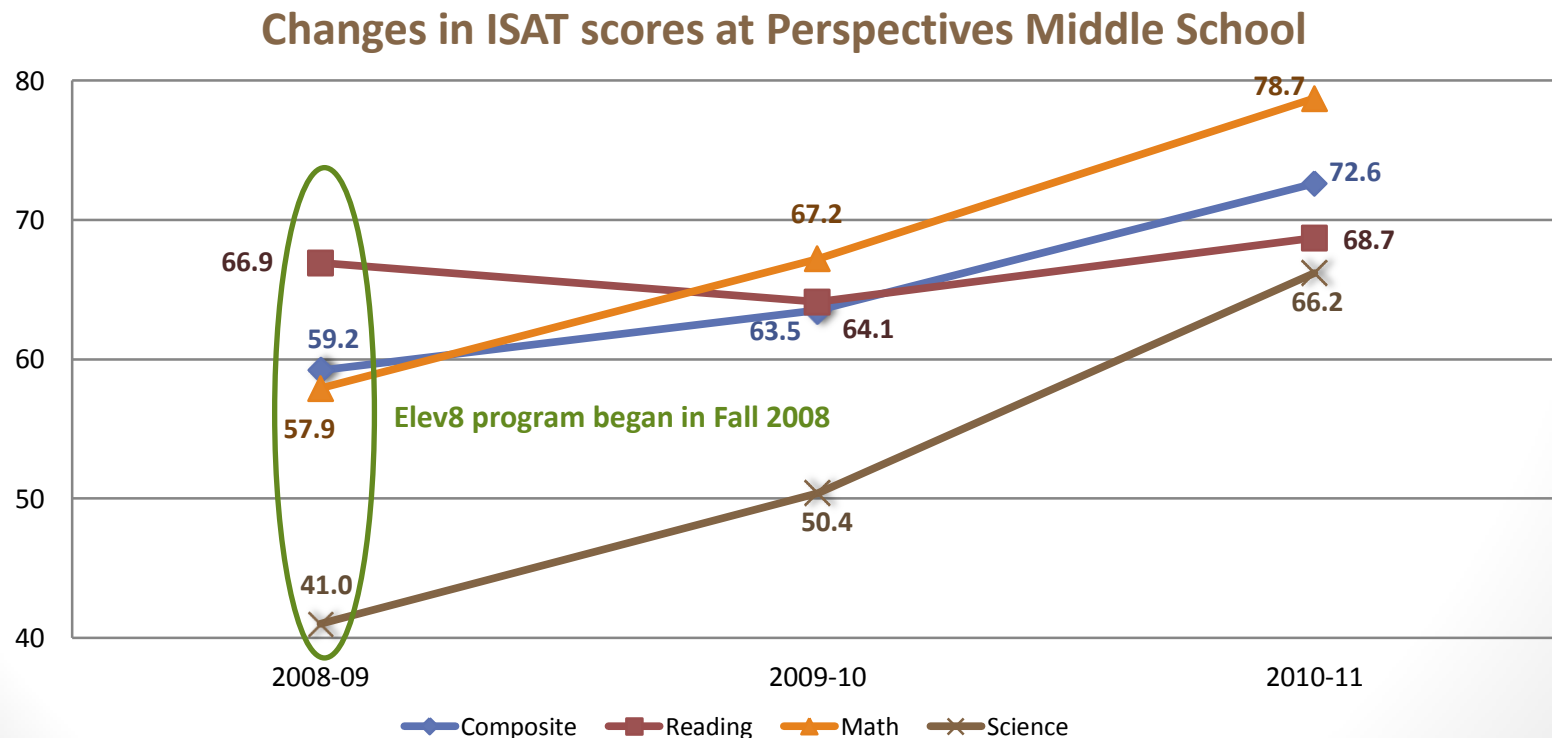

Elev8: Test scores at Perspectives Middle

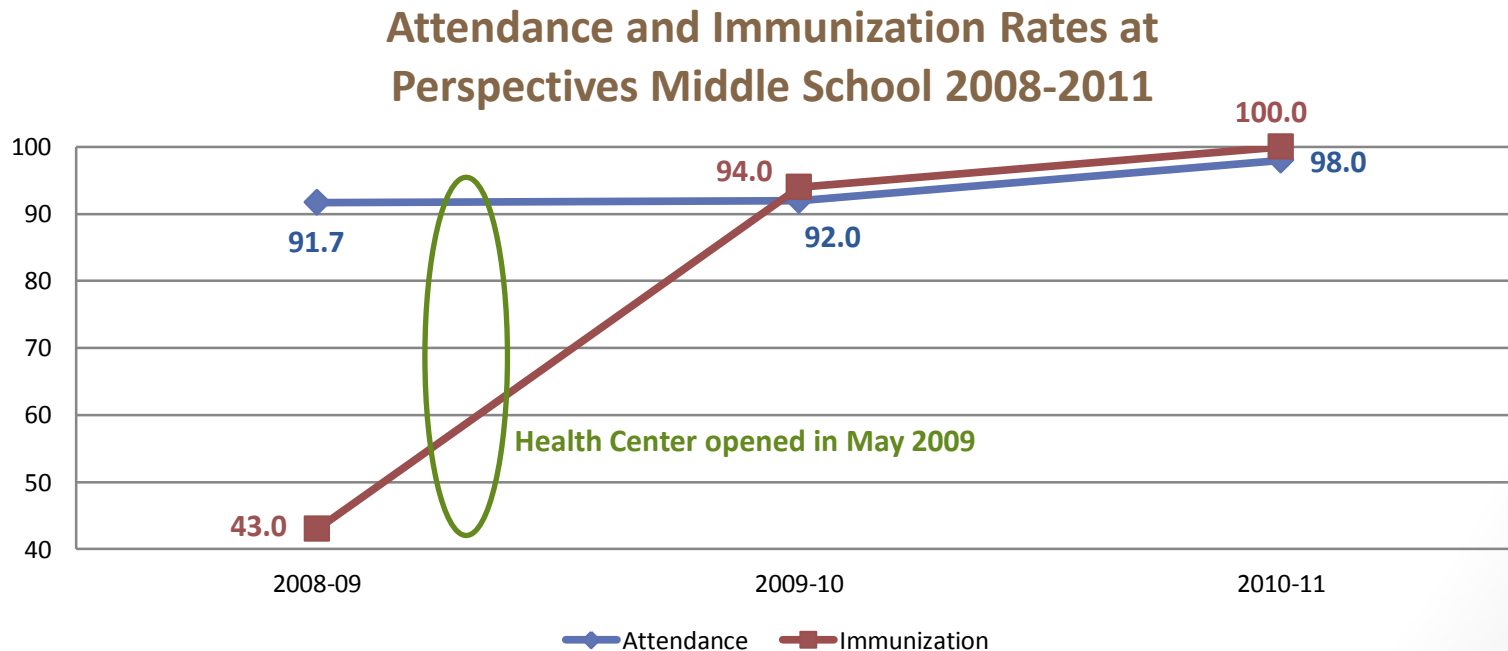
Starting in 2008, the Elev8 program at Perspectives Middle School has supported after-school programming, a math and reading coach, a “culture of calm,” and a longer school day.

Test scores have steadily improved during that time frame.



On-site health center boosts immunization and attendance rates

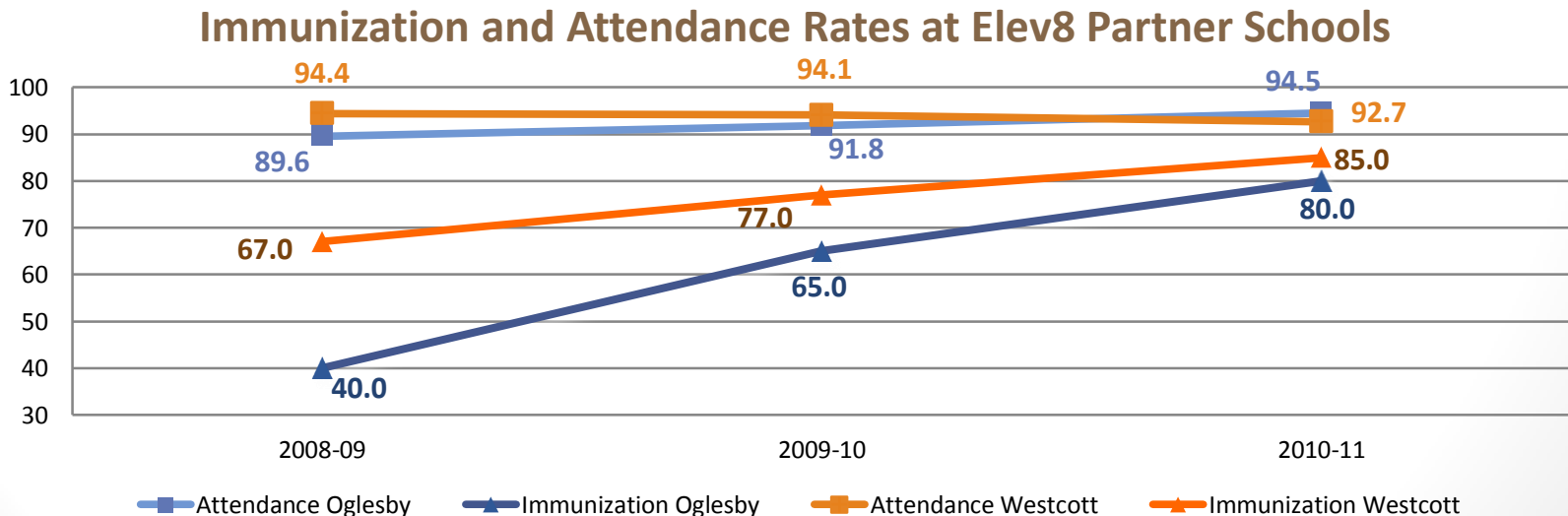
By providing – and promoting – an on-site health center, Perspectives Middle School was able to rapidly improve immunization compliance rates, which also helped improve attendance rates.



Health center helps nearby elementary schools improve immunization compliance

To support its feeder elementary schools, Auburn Gresham's School Yard Project promoted the free health services to families at Oglesby and Westcott Schools. Free busing was provided to the center.

127 students from Oglesby and 84 from Westcott received physicals, raising immunization compliance at both schools.
